Dear Friends,

As promised last week, I would like to share more information on our FAITH IN ACTION MINISTRY.

Vision: To grow a community of engaged disciples. To support the mission of this parish: "To hear the Gospel and Make a Difference." To be the change we wish to see in the world.

Mission: Inspired by the Gospel of Jesus Christ and the social teaching of the Church, Christ the King's "Faith in Action" ministry seeks to respond to the needs of our community, our country and our world. This group works to educate the parish with regard to these needs and to engage parishioners in the mission of responding - through advocacy, direct assistance, and solidarity with the poor. This ministry responds to social needs such as: health care, immigration, homelessness, hunger, peace, environment, and advocacy issues.

The Faith in Action Ministry will:

Operate as a committee within the structure set by the parish Pastoral Council of Christ the King Parish. (What is meant by structure? Base its activities on Catholic social teaching).

- Emphasize the "option for the poor" by pursuing issues that address the dignity and rights of people who are socially, politically, or economically disadvantaged.
- Maximize opportunities to assist and work with organizations, coalitions, and neighborhood groups to promote our common interests.
- Per the principle of subsidiarity, give priority to strategies that enable people to realize and act on their own power.
- Operate from and promote social action that includes private, personal commitments to justice and also public and institutional commitments to social justice.

Responsibilities

- Address issues of social justice and injustice wherever they may occur through the following: consciousness-raising, education and action-oriented activities directed towards our parish and local community as well as state and national government as appropriate.
- Encourage members of the parish community to serve by linking them with volunteer activities that address the needs of the most vulnerable and voiceless in our society.
- Coordinate and advocate for parish service programs and mission projects, e.g., parish twinning or partnership programs that promote solidarity, Thanksgiving food drive, seasonal food collections for the poor, special collections for emergency disaster relief, and the semiannual collections for local, national and international organizations.
- Be apprised of programs and resources available through Catholic Charities, the Deanery and the Diocese. Additionally, to be aware of efforts for legislative advocacy coordinated by the California Catholic Conference and the offices of the USCCB.
- Promote systemic change by informing and empowering parishioners to use principles of community organizing. These principles promote awareness of poverty, social analysis, and grassroots organizing so that the dignity and rights of each person may be preserved by social and religious institutions.
- Educate and empower parishioners and the outside community in the Church's Social Teachings.
- Strike a balance between focusing energies on social justice themes chosen by the congregation and welcoming new ideas generated by individuals, valuing community, collaboration, and inclusive engagement.

The steering committee will consist of up to twelve members, plus the Pastor and/or a staff member. Members will serve for four-year terms, with one renewable term. The committee meets monthly 11 times per year. Members are required to attend at least 75% of them or they will no longer be a member. Next weekend one of our current steering committee members will address you from the pulpit, inviting you to join this leadership team in our parish, followed by discernment process.

Acts: 10:25-26,34-35,44-48

Peter was originally skeptical about preaching the Gospel to non-Jews. Then one day, the Holy spirit summoned him to preach to the pagan army officer Cornelius and his household. The result, as we shall see, is the first recorded conversion of Gentiles to Christianity.

Second Reading:

1 John 4:7-10

The tradition of the apostle John's teachings is expressed in the first letter of John. There is a legend that John, in his old age, would simply repeat over and over to his people, "Love one another." Today's passage from that letter particularly illustrates this story.
